- Submit completed workbook to Learning Facilitator within one month of completion of DA course.

To Achieve Certified DA Status:

- Recommended that candidate acts as Assistant Instructor for minimum of 60 hours.
- Video tape a class that you are instructing and submit to the LF, or have the LF visit your club to observe you coach.
- The LF then submits the final paperwork

Dojo Instructor (Page 8 of National Coaching Certification Program):

Pre-Requisites:

- Minimum age 19
- Minimum Rank of Brown Belt
- Letter from sensei stating that participant meets technical requirements.
- Trained DA

To Achieve Trained DI Status:

- Dojo Instructor course through Judo Sask
- Submit completed workbook to Learning Facilitator within one month of completion of DI Course.
- Minimum Rank of Shodan
- Complete online Making Ethical Decisions if old Level 1.

To Achieve Certified DI Status:

- Recommended that candidate act as club instructor for minimum of 120 hours.
- Video tape a class that you are instructing and submit to the LF, or have the LF visit your club to observe you coach.
- The LF then submits the final paperwork

Level 3 (Pages 9 & 10 of National Coaching Certification Program):

Pre-Requisites:

- Minimum age 21
- Minimum rank of Shodan
- Trained DI (or old Level 2)
- Letter of recommendation from provincial association stating participant meets technical requirements.
- Completion of Level 3 Theory though local sport office.

Practical Evaluation:

- Minimum Rank of Nidan
- Certified DI (or old Level 2)
- Completion of online Making Ethical Decision if old Level 2
- Coach athletes at provincial or national level for 240 hours. Hours do not begin until both Level 3 Theory and Technical components are completed.
