WEIGH IN: There will be no official weigh in. Weight should be recorded wearing judogi pants and t-shirt. Weights must be submitted online during the registration process on Trackie.

Draw sheets will be made based on entries according to relative size and number of entries. Athletes wishing to move up into older divisions must have permission from their coaches and be approved by the tournament director.

******* Draw Format for ne-waza *****.**

- For **U8** divisions, these will be exhibition matches to allow coaches and competitors to be on the mat at the same time to learn the ne-waza tournament system. These matches will be 1 minute and 30 seconds in length straight time with no scoring. All competitors will receive a medal.
- For **U10** divisions, Draws will be made for the divisions based on entries. A round robin pool system will be used where each entrant will compete against the other pool members. Smaller pools may do a double round robin to get each competitor more matches. These matches will be 2 minutes in length straight time with no scoring. All competitors will receive a medal.
- For **U12** divisions, Draws will be made for the divisions based on entries. A round robin pool system will be used where each entrant will compete against the other pool members. Smaller pools may do a double round robin to get each competitor more matches. These matches will be 2 minutes in length straight time with no scoring. All competitors will receive a medal.
- For **SWG** divisions, Draws will be made for the divisions based on entries. A round robin pool system will be used where each entrant will compete against the other pool members. Smaller pools may do a double round robin to get each competitor more matches. These matches will be 3 minutes in length stop time with scoring. Golden score will apply if the match is tied at the end of regulation time. Only competitors placed first, second or third will receive a medal.
- For **Kodomo no kata**, each of set 3, set 4 and set 5 will be competed separately based on entries. All competitors will then receive a medal.

******* Draw Format for tachi-waza *****.**

- For **U10** divisions, Draws will be made for the divisions based on entries. A round robin pool system will be used where each entrant will compete against the other pool members. Smaller pools may do a double round robin to get each competitor more matches. These matches will be 2 minutes in length straight time with no scoring. All competitors will receive a medal.
- For **U12** divisions, Draws will be made for the divisions based on entries. A round robin pool system will be used where each entrant will compete against the other pool members. Smaller pools may do a double round robin to get each competitor more matches. These matches will be 2 minutes in length straight time with no scoring. All competitors will receive a medal.

Tournament Guidelines:

- Members must be in good standing with Judo Saskatchewan.
- Modified Judo Canada Tournament Sanctioning rules will apply.
- The ne-waza competition is open to all belt ranks, the tachi-waza is for full yellow belts and up.
- There will be no shime waza or kansetsu waza for any U14 and under matches.
- The tournament committee, in its sole discretion, reserves the right to make any changes necessary in the best interest of the athletes.
- Age and divisions may be combined if unsuitable numbers of athletes are registered in a division.
- Females must wear a plain white, short sleeved, rounded neck t-shirt under their judogi.
- NO pants below the knee to be worn under the gi pants (Shorts under the gi pants will be allowed)
- Hair must be worn up above the shoulders (male and female), hair bands may not contain any metal or hard plastic.
- All piercings, jewelry and bracelets must be removed.
- No use of bleeding dyes on the body or hair of competitors is allowed. In cases such use is undetected and results in damage to the equipment of the opponent or the tatami, the competitor will be disqualified, and the member will be charged for the damage.
- All competitors *must* have a white judogi. Blue judogis can only be worn when the athlete is the second competitor in a match. All judogis must be regulatory size.

There will be a concession on site operated by the Koseikan Parents Group.
As there are attendees with severe food allergies, please do not bring outside food into the dojo.
