Judo Saskatchewan Awards and Recognition policy

PURPOSE OF THE AWARDS AND RECOGNITION POLICY IS:

To adequately and effectively recognize the contribution of our volunteers and athletes at all levels who are crucial to the development and advancement of Judo in Saskatchewan

AUTHORITY/DECISION MAKING:

The Board of Directors has the final authority to interpret and apply this policy. The Judo Saskatchewan Director at large will have the authority/responsibility to collect nominations for all selected categories and will be responsible for obtaining all cards, certificates and awards to be given out each year. The President must approve all recommendations for cards, certificates and awards.

SECTION 1: COMMITTEE RECOGNITION

All Committee Chairs and Board Members

- Judo Saskatchewan Business cards

After two (2) years of service:

- All Committee Chairs and Board Members - Certificate of Appreciation

After four (4) years of service:

- All Committee Members - Certificate of Appreciation
- Board Members and Committee Chairs - Contribution Plaque

After six (6) years of service:

- Board Members & Chairs - T shirt with Judo Saskatchewan Logo
- Committee Members - Contribution plaque

After eight (8) years of service:

- Board Members & Chairs - Golf shirt with Judo Saskatchewan Logo
- Committee Members - T shirt with Judo Saskatchewan Logo

SECTION 2: ANNUAL RECOGNITION AWARDS NOMINATION PROCEDURE:

Nominations shall be made using a required form and must be filed by September 1st of each year. These awards will be presented at the first provincial event of the year. Names of each recipient will be announced on the Judo Saskatchewan Facebook, and News section of the Judo Saskatchewan website. Note: Awards will not be given out if suitable candidates are not found.

JUDO SASK VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR AWARD

Nominated by the President of Judo Saskatchewan

The award will be presented to the most deserving volunteer (judoka or otherwise) who has shown, in the year nominated for, the true spirit of volunteerism and has given outstanding service to Judo Sask.

VINCE SEYMOUR MEMORIAL AWARD

Nominated by the Chair of Officials

The award will be presented to the referee who has best:

- demonstrated support and encouragement to all levels of referees.
- officiated at tournaments of all levels throughout the province of Saskatchewan
- demonstrated a high level of proficiency in refereeing

DARRYL POTTS JUDO SASK SPIRIT OF JUDO AWARD

Nominated by the Chair of Participation & Development

The award will be presented to the individual who has best:

- demonstrated general support and encouragement to judoka on multitude of levels.
- encouraged and displayed an attitude, which is in keeping with the spirit of judo.

MERVE POINTER MEMORIAL AWARD FOR COMMITMENT TO COACHING

Nominated by the Chair of Coaches

The award will be presented to the coach who

- has been actively coaching athletes.
- have made a significant contribution, in coaching, to Judo Sask at a club and/or provincial level.
- must not be an employee of Judo Sask.

JIM O’SULLIVAN, MEMORIAL AWARD FOR LONG TERM DEDICATION TO JUDO IN SASKATCHEWAN

Nominated by the President of Judo Saskatchewan and approved by the Board of Directors

The award will be presented to a person who has demonstrated a long term dedication for the betterment of judo in Saskatchewan in one or more of the following areas:

- as a builder
- as a coach,
- as a referee
- as an administrator
- as a volunteer

JUDO SASK CLUB OF THE YEAR

Nominated by the President of Judo Saskatchewan

The award will be presented to the club who has best

- met the requirements of club status, by Judo Sask
- encouraged club member participation in Judo Sask events
- encouraged and displayed an attitude, which is in keeping with the true philosophies of judo.
- fostered and displayed team spirit and “fair play” ethics

SECTION 3: MOST OUTSTANDING ATHLETE OF THE YEAR AWARDS

Nominated by the Judo Saskatchewan Selection Committee This award is presented to the Judoka who distinguish themselves amongst their peers with the best results for the year and continuously show commitment, determination and the desire to improve.

Most Outstanding Veteran Female & Male Athletes:

The result is calculated based on total points earned from results in the following events with a minimum of three entries and one win. All points must be obtained in the Veterans division.
